Statement	Statements are sentences that express facts, ideas or opinions.		
	It says something is true.		
	● It ends with a period. (.)		
	Examples:		
	1. This machine is easy.		
	2. Mom is in the kitchen.		
	3. Riya plays piano.		
Question	• A question is an asking sentence.		
	It is a sentence that asks something.		
	● It ends with a question mark. (?)		
	Questions are also known as interrogative sentences.		
	Examples:		
	1. Is this machine easy?		
	2. Is mom in the kitchen?		
	3. Does Riya play piano?
